Alpha Delta Reaches Agreement With National Fraternity

Fall is here and football season is in full swing. We can hear the chants from Ross-Ade Stadium now! However, as we come back to campus this fall, it is important for us to communicate and clarify what has happened over the past three years at Alpha Delta.

The Alpha Delta Chapter of Theta Chi Fraternity has gone through some ups and downs over the last few years. Every chapter within our beloved Fraternity has experienced some "bad apples" over time; however, we discovered in 2006 that Alpha Delta had multiple bad apples which led to our chapter being reorganized.

Since 2006, feelings have been hurt, blame has bounced from group to group, brothers have walked away from the Fraternity, accusations and falsehoods have been filtered through the Fraternity, and more importantly a huge wedge has been driven through our chapter. Each one of us can take some blame in what happened. Whether it was Purdue University, the national organization, the house corporation, the undergraduates, the house mother, or even the alumni who have not been involved, all of us can take some responsibility in the way things occurred before, during or after the reorganization.

There have been many different relationships that have been tested over the past three years. While some may have been stretched to their breaking point, none have been broken.

One was the relationship between the Alpha Delta House Corporation (ADHC) and The Norwich Housing Corporation

(Norwich). As you may or may not know, Norwich extended a generous loan of \$880,605.11 to the ADHC in 2003 and thus has two liens on the property. If the ADHC had placed the mortgages with a local bank, 800 David Ross Road would probably not now be the home to Alpha Delta. Over the past three years, Norwich has provided the ADHC multiple grace periods and extensions while the National Fraternity helped rebuild the chapter. It is important for each Alpha Delta alumnus to understand that the House Corporation

had accrued over \$150,000.00 in interest over the past three years; as such, Norwich has not been able to loan out those funds to other Theta Chi House Corporations. In early 2009, Norwich and your House Corporation came to agreement that Norwich would forgive \$100,000.00 of the accrued interest, as long as the current mortgages are paid as agreed by the ADHC from here forward.

All of Theta Chi has suffered from this situation; however, today is a new day. The past is the past. Theta Chi Fraternity is becoming stronger and stronger every day at Purdue. Local, regional and national volunteers have worked with the chapter to bring it back to where it is today. Each one of you would be proud to have our current brothers wear our Badge of Theta Chi. Countless volunteers have and are dedicating time and energy to better our Chapter in West Lafayette. Alpha Delta is in a position to once again be "the leader" on the Purdue campus due

to the support of the above mentioned groups.

So, on behalf of the House Corporation, The Norwich Housing Corporation and Theta Chi Fraternity, thank you for your continued support during these tough times. We also encourage you to supply us the names of young men that you consider worthy of membership in Theta Chi. Alumni, Students Work Together To Secure Largest Pledge Class Since Reorganization

With less than fifty students living inhouse this year, the primary focus of rush has been to bring in two large pledge classes so residency at 800 David Ross Road will exceed seventy next year in order to meet the annual budget. The newly created Alpha Delta Chapter Advisory Board has ten areas of focus for chapter health, one being rush and recruitment. Steve Fero and Chuck Gillespie, both with human resources backgrounds, volunteered to lead this new advisory role for the chapter.

In assessing recent rush results, it became apparent that some institutional knowledge had been lost in rush strategy and tactics. The goals for Rush Fall 2009 were to have 20+ high quality pledges, engage alumni to be involved in rush, target pre-qualified rushees prior to the start of school, and achieve 90% bid acceptance or better. A goal of 30 pledges was later set out by alumni.

Current Chapter President. Kyle Thompson, and Vice President, Ross Adams, returned from their summer Theta Chi leadership seminar with ideas and energy to initiate a strong fall rush campaign. Kyle, Ross, along with Rush Chairs, Josh Borchardt and Manninen, and Pledge Marshall, Tommy Allen, pushed the brotherhood to build and populate an online rush spreadsheet which ultimately contained the names and contact information for over 300 target rushees recommended by brothers. alumni, and friends of the fraternity.

During the first week of the four week rush campaign, twenty-two bids were given out to targeted rushees. Although new IFC guidelines sometimes hindered high volume recruiting with online registration and communal transportation requirements, the students continued to bring target rushees to 800 David Ross Road in pursuit of a pledge class of thirty. An early pledge induction helped gain the recruiting assistance of new pledges involved in recruitment of members for their pledge class.

Alumni traveled to campus for several of the rush functions, held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6-8PM. The "Room Talks" rush function had over 10 alumni from Chicago and Indianapolis involved in helping to close outstanding bids and provide support to the rush effort of the students. The presence of alumni at rush functions was mentioned by several student brothers as having an important influence and impact upon the success of rush.

Ultimately, the fall 2009 class will have 29 pledges, one short of the goal of thirty. Pledge Marshall, Tommy Allen, is leading this new class, but continued support, presence, and visibility from the alumni is being encouraged. Focus is now on a spring rush campaign to bring another 20+ pledges to Alpha Delta and retention of enough of these new pledges that fifty new brothers join the remaining upperclassmen in the fall of 2010.

All alumni should mark their calendars for Friday, November 20th when Alpha Delta will be holding the initiation of the largest pledge class since the reorganization. The ceremony will begin at 6:00 PM at the chapter house.

Alumni Corporation Responsibilities

The following is a list of the positions and responsibilities of the newly formed Chapter Advisory Board. If you are not currently involved in chapter activities, please consider taking a position on the board.

President

Greg Cagnassola

- Serve as the central communications center and executive management function for the chapter.
- Mentor Chapter Officers on leadership skills.
- Chair Chapter Standards Board.
- Coordinate responses to parents with applicable Chairman.
- Handle registrations and payments for students and alumni to attend various conferences and conventions. Establish reimbursement policies and payment options with Foundation.
- Represent the house corporation and provide administration in all risk management issues.
- Manage, negotiate and administer all insurance programs – workers comp, general liability, property. Manage claims. We currently have one large claim in process that will take some time.
- Execute the student encumbrance process working with the dean of students office this is key to collections (our uncollectible are less than 1% used to be greater than 10%)
- Work with Finance Chairman to do all the financial planning and projections to adequately "anticipate" all income and expenses.

Membership Chair

Position Currently Open

 Maintain the active status and contact data for all students on campus (in, out, new member classes, graduates, suspensions, expulsions, boarders).

- Work with national staff to obtain pins so they are available for next class.
- Request and receive roster information periodically from the dean of students office to determine the status of each student with Purdue – i.e. who has dropped or graduated or otherwise left Purdue.
- Administer and establish the budget and contract negotiations for the annual fraternity composite photograph.

Scholarship Chair

Position Currently Open

- Obtain and maintain all academic information for all students.
- Provide mentoring on the scholastic/social balance and time management.
- Provide mentoring on resume and interviewing skills.
- Coordinate alumni visits to discuss careers.
- Coordinate scholarship dinner each semester.

Finance Chair-Treasurer

Larry Lammers

- Establish the room and board house bill rental rates, security deposit, out of house brother rates each year. Keep at market.
- Administer the collection of executed housing contracts for each member
- Manage the financial affairs of the Student Corporation – establish budgets, approve purchases, sign checks, manage collections, etc.
- Currently perform the check signing function for the students. May be revised in future.
- Manage collections and invoicing for students "in house", "out of house" and "new members". Work with the independent accountant.
- Manage the checking and savings accounts for the Student Corp, Alumni Corp. and the Foundation. Currently 7 accounts.

- Be the direct contact and reviewer of the paid independent accountant for the student and the alumni corporations. Generally involves 2-3 calls or e-mails per week.
- Be available and respond to all parent calls with respect to housing and payment issues. Usually heaviest at the beginning and the end of each semester.
- Establish budget, procedures, negotiate and manage the food catering service
- Manage the financial affairs of the Alumni Corporation – establish budgets, approve purchases, execute contracts, sign checks, manage and review the activities of the accountant
- Do all the financial planning and projections to adequately "anticipate" all income and expenses.
- Receive all money for the Student Corp, the Alumni Corp and the Foundation.
 Log giving and payments into databases, make bank deposits and refresh database with return addresses.

Rush Chairman

Steve Fero & Chuck Gillespie

- Work closely with Chapter Rush Chairs to solicit candidates from current members and alumni.
- Drive the Rush program and insure participation of alumni.
- Work with the Facilities Chairman, and Finance Chairman to implement a boarder program when necessary including recruitment, evaluation of candidates, negotiation of deals and selection of rooms.

Pledge Retention Chairman Position Currently Open

• Recruit alumni sponsors to provide individual support and mentor each

pledge

- Work closely with Chapter Pledge Marshal and alumni to provide status of each pledge throughout pledgeship – identify "at-risk" pledges
- Collaborate with alumni CAB and Pledge Marshal to development action plan to retain at-risk pledges identified

Facilities Chairman

Kris Smith with support from Sean Hanas

- Function as the property manager for the Chapter House. Manage all maintenance programs, secure reliable vendors and keep systems running properly and house in good condition.
- Manage internal property systems: chiller, fire, spoke detection, kitchen
- Manage the exterior maintenance activities – i.e. lawn cutting, landscape maintenance and snow and ice removal.
- Be mentor for the House Manager
- Receive calls and e-mails concerning house conditions.
- Facilitate the contractor hiring process.
- Approve reimbursement of expenses.
- Maintain the master keying program, the individual student room keys for all doors for the chapter house and the 3 push button combination locks on the exterior doors. Strict Ongoing key maintenance is extremely important to the overall security.
- Order or otherwise obtain and maintain all furniture and equipment (kitchen) for the chapter house. Bunk beds, mattresses, couches, chairs, dining room tables, chairs, kitchen equipment, etc.
- Negotiate the "trash collection" contract for school year and the summer months

 adjust upward or downward due to occupancy fluctuations.
- Hold the line on "student" improvement projects to the chapter house (Painting or building things in the house must be approved by Chairman).
- Provide technical IT support for the telephone system and the internet system and the internet system and the internal network within the chapter house. Technical support is provided via a manager and a Purdue co-op student who are both paid by American Structurepoint.

Communications Chairman

 Keep track of who gives, send thank you notes, work with Father Phil to create request letter.
- Send gift acknowledgement letters to Foundation donors for tax purposes.
- Plan and organize the annual Indianapolis Dinner.
- Handle all mass regular mailings and reproduction thereof (i.e. homecoming, parents day, Indianapolis Dinner, scholarship dinner, fundraising appeals)
- Pay postage

- Manage large capital projects when they come up. Recent past includes the installation of a monumental masonry yard sign. Pending project requested by our insurance carrier is the installation of extensive exterior lighting for security purposes.
- Manage and administer all fundraising activities for projects. Identification of big donors, make calls, send thank you's, keep records of gifts.

• Manage the Building on the Brotherhood Campaign – send out invoices based upon each contributors pledge agreement. Send out past due reminders, maintain records of who has given and send out thank you's.

Board Member

- Be present at each induction and initiation to get all the paperwork filled out, collect the funds due National for registration.
- Support the current Chairmen.
